

Here are some tasks for the team to work on during the season. This is just a sample list – the main point as coach is to make sure they keep working! Even teams with very high scores can find things to work on and improve.

Robot Game/Tech Briefing

- Receive the team Challenge Set
- Build Challenge Set pieces to exact specs
- Look on firstinspires.org to note the exact setup of the table
- Build a robot (check the robot rules in challenge doc)
- Check Challenge Updates
- Strategize which missions to attempt
- Work on missions
- Check Challenge Updates
- Build attachments
- Re-strategize
- Check Challenge Updates
- Continue to work on missions
- Redesign robot if necessary
- Check Challenge Updates
- Attempt new missions
- Combine missions/work on timing
- Check Challenge Updates
- Practice "official" runs
- Practice talking about robot design and programming, read the judges rubrics at

- Save backups of the programs
- Check Challenge Updates

- Create an innovative solution to the problem

- Brainstorm how to present information to the judges (type of presentation)

- Decide on presentation type
- Work on script/plan
- Supplementary research to fill in any holes
- Make sure script/plan contains facts and the innovative solution
- Practice presentation
- Share innovative solution with others in the community – branch out from just showing parents/coaches
- Go to a scrimmage or qualifier
- Incorporate judge's comments into presentation
